What form does cyberviolence take in teen dating relationships?

A boyfriend or girlfriend may:

- “ Deluge their partner with harassing emails or text messages, scream over the phone or insult their partner in texts and/or webcam posts.
- “ Control their partner’s movements with a geolocation app or program (like Snapchat or Facebook).
- “ Post inappropriate comments or rumours on social media sites.
- “ Post photos or videos on social media without their partner’s consent in order to humiliate them, claiming it’s just for fun.
- “ Force their partner to post everything they do online when they are not together, so that they can keep track of their movements and activities.
- “ Demand that their partner stay on their cell phone every evening, so they can have them all to themselves.
- “ Force their partner to give them all their Internet passwords (e.g., Facebook, Instagram).
- “ Blackmail their partner by threatening to distribute an intimate photo.
